Early College Program at Goode

What are the Early College Program Eligibility Requirements?

Students must meet the following eligibility requirements *each semester* in order to remain enrolled in the Early College Program; however, students do not have to retake the College Entrance Exam once they've passed unless their scores have expired. College Entrance Exam scores expire after 1 year.

Minimum of 2.5 GPA

Minimum of 90% Attendance

Pass the English and/or Math college entrance exam

What are the different types of Associate's Degrees I can pursue at Goode?



Networking (AAS)

The Networking Tech AAS degree teaches students to design, deploy and manage wired and wireless technologies, including LAN/WAN networks, the Internet, intranets and other data communications systems.



Web Development (AAS/AS)

The IT Web Development AS/ AAS programs teaches students to design, build and maintain websites and web content.



Computer Science (AS)

The CS AS degree is designed to prepare students for transfer to a four-year institution and eventual careers in fields such as programming, systems analysis, or computer research.

What's the difference between an Associate's of Applied Science (AAS) and an Associate's of Science (AS) Degree?

Associate's of Science (AS)

Easily transferrable to 4-year universities given that degrees require more general education course requirements.



AS in Web Development

AS in Computer Science

Associate's of Applied Science (AAS)

Requires more technical courses in order to prepare students for employment after graduation. Some courses may transfer to 4-year universities. IBM only accepts interns who are pursuing an AAS degree.



AAS in Networking



Can I change my Associate's Degree Pathway?

Yes, you can request to change your Associate's Degree Pathway at the end of a semester. You may not change your degree pathway in the middle of a semester. You may only switch your degree to one of the four IT pathways offered at Goode. Students are not permitted to take courses that are not required for their degree. Please note that changing your degree pathway will delay your ability to graduate with your Associate's Degree.
